

Dear Parent/Carer

Communication from Surrey Police

We are writing to share some information that has been provided to schools across Surrey, in light of recent national developments. While these matters may be concerning, we want to reassure you that the safety and wellbeing of our students remains our highest priority.

Over the summer, there has been an increase in protest activity in some parts of the UK, particularly around the use of hotels to accommodate asylum seekers. In Surrey, we have not seen the same level of disruption, and our local police teams continue to work closely with schools and communities to ensure everyone feels safe and supported.

Surrey Police is aware of some online posts and videos suggesting threats made by individuals staying in hotels. We understand that such content can be distressing. However, no specific threat has been identified to any school in Surrey, and police are actively monitoring the situation.

To provide reassurance:

- Police patrols have been increased in key areas.
- Youth Engagement Officers are visiting schools to speak with staff and students.
- Any new information will be shared with schools as appropriate.

We encourage families to be mindful of what they see online. Not all information is accurate, and it's important to help children understand how to question and verify what they read. This includes recognising the difference between:

- Misinformation – false information shared without harmful intent.
- Disinformation – false information deliberately spread to mislead.

We know this can be a challenging time for some communities. Please continue to support your children in having open, respectful conversations with their peers, and help them feel confident in responding to difficult messages or behaviours in a thoughtful way.
