After schools have had an excellent uptake, especially the football ones, with most having a waiting list due to high demand. This also has given priority to our PP to help them be more active. 24 year 6 children have received sports ambassador training from Active survey and have been running lunchtime activities at the infant school. New lunchtime equipment has been implemented on Football Free Friday, promoting tennis and coordination. OPAL play has used some of the sports premium budget to support resourcing the new scheme. The new speaker has been a success on Friday's, children have used the pom poms and enjoyed having the music. More spaces have been implemented across the playground and the field or a variety of opportunities for active play.	Next year, new sports ambassadors will receive their training and continue to work with the infants to support their lunchtimes. There may be opportunities to increase the number of music days next year. Sports ambassadors to run an afternoon event to teach infant children games they could play at lunchtime using the Physifun cards.
