Nursery and Reception

In Nursery, our youngest learners have been exploring the theme "Shall I Tell You About Me?", while Reception children have been thinking about "What Makes Me Marvellous?". These topics have given the children a wonderful opportunity to learn about themselves and their emotions in creative and engaging ways.

A favourite activity has been creating self-portraits, where the children expressed their individuality through bright and colourful artwork. To deepen their understanding of feelings, both Nursery and Reception enjoyed the much-loved story "The Colour Monster", which introduces different emotions and helps children recognise and talk about how they feel.

Reception children also made their own mirrors to practise showing different facial expressions. At home, they worked on a 'Chatter Box' project, which encouraged them to share their interests and likes with friends and teachers at school. As part of this learning journey, we also explored family life. The children talked about who lives in their homes and the special relationships they share with family members.

This topic has been a fantastic way for children to celebrate what makes them unique while appreciating the differences in others. It's been a joyful journey of self-discovery, and we're excited to see where their curiosity leads next!


As geographers we have found out where we live in the world and how the world is divided into continents and countries. As scientists we have studied "Sensitive bodies" we have used our senses to discover the wonder of our world through sight, sound, smell, touch and taste!

As artists we have studied line and how it helps us to create art, with textures and using different medium to taking it outside to make wild art!

Wow! What a wonderful start to the new academic year we have had. The children have settled well into their new classes and have shown the school values. Our topic this term is Castles and the children have explored the Bayeux Tapestry and how William the Conqueror became King of England. The children have also been exploring the book 'Rapunzel' by Bethan Woollvin. This book takes a traditional tale and adds a twist! The children have enjoyed making predictions about what will happen next. In Science the children have been looking at life cycles and how to stay healthy.

A Trip to Windsor Castle

The most exciting part of the half term had to be our trip to Windsor Castle where the children explored the grounds, state apartments and St George's Chapel.





As we approach the end of our first half term in Year 3, it has been a pleasure to witness how smoothly the children have transitioned into life at the Junior School. They have shown great enthusiasm and curiosity, and we are so proud of the start they have made.

This half term in English, the children have really dived into our cross-curricular learning, with all of their writing closely linked to our History and Science topics.

They've written their own Stone Age stories, researched and created explanation texts about different types of stones, and explored biographies—focusing on Mary

Anning, the famous fossil hunter. The children have really enjoyed making these connections across subjects, and it's been lovely to see how engaged they have been.

In Science, the children explored the formation of sedimentary, metamorphic and igneous rocks using sweets, tested the permeability of different rock types, and created model fossils using plasticine and PVA glue.

We've also examined soils from three different areas, exploring their textures and how well they hold their shape. The children have really enjoyed getting stuck in and applying their knowledge through these practical activities.

In Science, Year 4 have been exploring the topic of 'Solids, Liquids, and Gases.' The children took part in an exciting experiment using thermometers, where we placed water at different temperatures, including ice. We made predictions about what the temperature would be and then measured the actual temperature using the thermometers. It was fantastic to see the children discussing their results and comparing them to their predictions.

We are so impressed with the enthusiasm and curiosity displayed and it's clear that we have some budding scientists in Year 4!

From exploring Space to leading a fantastic Harvest Assembly, our children have had a busy start to the year.

We kicked off our Space topic with an unforgettable visit to the planetarium, where the children were mesmerised by the immersive star dome, in which they learned about planets, and the wonders of our solar system. Back at school they were excited to create their own model solar systems.

The children also thoroughly enjoyed walking to St John's church and exploring the features of the church.

It has been great to see the children enthralled in learning about the continent Europe. They all chose a country from Europe they were interested in to research.

The children have also loved leading the school's Harvest Assembly sharing poems and reflections on gratitude and their delightful singing made for a fantastic assembly.

Finally, the children have enjoyed learning how to peel and chop when making vegetable soup.

Clubs



'Best Start in Life' website with parents

On 1 September, the Department for Education (DfE) launched the 'Best Start in Life' website.

The Best Start in Life website has replaced the 'Childcare Choices' website as the main source of information for early education and childcare support – offering a broader range of resources for families, including eligibility for childcare offers, and support on pregnancy through to starting school and beyond.

Although the website has changed, the offers for parents – such as support for working parents and the two-year-old childcare offer – are not affected. Visitors to the current Childcare Choices website will be automatically redirected.
